The hike in DA and DR rates will be effective from July 1, 2021, the minister said adding that this move will impact 48.34 lakh central government employees and 65.26 lakh government pensioners.

YOGI'S EX-GRATIA RELIEF FOR FAMILIES OF THOSE WHO DIED ON P'YAT POLL DUTY

Lucknow: Families of 2,020 government employees who died of Covid-19 during the Panchayat poll duty will finally get Rs 30 lakh each in compensation from the Uttar Pradesh government, more than a month after the State cabinet cleared the proposal.

The ex-gratia for the deceased government staff was increased from Rs 15 lakh to 30 lakh in the state cabi-

He took up shooting at the age of 13 and has practiced daily ever since without a fail. During his early days, he used to travel 15 km each way on buses to his club run by Aryan Gateways Sports Foundation. His coach Amit Sheoran identified his talent and groomed him from grassroot level. At the age of 19, Chaudhary is all set to make the country proud.

SATISH KUMAR

Satish is an amateur boxer who will represent India in Olympics in the +91kg category and won bronze medals in 2014 Asian games and in 2018 Commonwealth games. He defeated Otgonbayer Daivii in the Asian Boxing Olympic qualifiers.

SATISH LOOKS TO PUT HIS BEST 'PUNCH' FORWARD

ce Indian boxer Satish Kumar etched his name in historybooks by becoming the first pugilist from the country to qualify for the Olympic Games in the super heavy weight category (91 kg and above). The Tokyo bound boxer comes from a family of farmers. He hails from Bulandshahr, Uttar Pradesh. Following the footsteps of his elder brothers, Satish joined Indian Army as a teenager and it was during his service days when he discovered his true finding. Satish picked up boxing and started his professional training at the age of 19. He was initially trained by the coaches in the boxing camp at the Kumaon Regiment and started competing on the national stage at the age of 21.



MAIRAJ KHAN

Mairaj Ahmad Khan is a sports shooter who will be representing India in men's skeet at the Tokyo Olympics. In 2016 Rio Olympics, he was the first-ever Indian skeet shooter to qualify for the Olympics and and this will be his second Olympics.

WITH SHOOTING IN HIS DNA. **MAIRAJ AIMS FOR GOLD**

airai Ahmad Khan was born into an affluent shooting family, as his father, brother and uncles were state-level trap shooters. Despite been surrounded by professional shooters, a young Mairaj fell in love with cricket and dreamt of playing for India one day. But, cricket could only remain a weekend hobby and he soon started shooting after finishing college in 1998. Mairaj became a professional shooter and won his first gold at the 2007 National Shooting Championship in Delhi.He went on to bag the gold medal again in 2009, 2010, and 2016 editions of the championship.Mairaj made his international debut during the ISSF World Cup at Lonato, Italy in the year 2003. For almost a decade (2005 to 2015) he participated in 15 ISSF World Cups held in 22 nations but didn't win any medals.

Lucknow: Women have breached yet another male-dominated bastion - the recently concluded Panchayat polls, where they have bagged 53.70 % of the total seats overshooting the one third quota fixed for them.

Altogether 31,212 women have won the election for the post of Gram Pradhan, 447 for

for the post of district panchayat chairperson in the panchayat elections this year, according to the data available with the state election commission.

This is for the first time in the history of UP, when such a large number of women have won panchayat elections. Women have won 31,212 out of 58,176 village head posts, claiming 53.7% of the block pramukh and 42 seats and outnumber-

YOGI-LED GOVT TO REDUCE IMR IN UP BY HALF WITHIN 10 YEARS

Gorakhpur: The state government will expand facilities for institutional delivery and care of infants in hospitals. The move is aimed at stabilising the population in the state and reducing maternal and infant deaths in a timebound manner, to achieve the target of the New Uttar Pradesh Population Policy 2021-2030, which was recently unveiled by CM Yogi Adityanath.

Provisions have been made for ensuring health services for all and for paying special attention to pregnant women, infants, sick newborns and children who are severely malnourished. The new policy has set a target of reducing the neonatal mortality rate of infants that takes place as, 62 children died in within 28 days of their urban areas and 82 in birth from 32 to 22 by rural areas per thou-2026 and to 12 by 2030.





The twenty one armies included the Panchalas, the Somakas, Kumtirastra, Cheddi, two Matsyas-, Karusha, Kekaya, Pandya, Chola, Chera, Kasi, Ashmaka, Kulinda, Patachchara, Srinjaya, Malla, Ashwamedha, Vrishnis, Dravida, two Nishad kingdoms, one faction of the Kamboj, Ulluka, Kumara, Prabhadraka, Rakshasa and Nagas. We therefore see that both the armies received support from all corners of Bharat-in the case of Pandavas - their allies stretched from the Ulluka and Kamboja kingdom in the North to the Dravidas in the South, Rakshasas and Nagas in the east, besides of course the Yadavas, whose territories extended from Mathura to Dwarka.

Pandavas were the Panchalas. The Panchala territory was adjacent to the Kuru territory – the area corresponding to the large tract from Kurukshetra and including Indraprastha and Hastinapur. The Kurus were close to the banks for the Yamuna - etymologically the term Yadav comes from Yamuna - but their territory also touched the Ganga. Panchalas occupied the territory between the Ganga and the Saryu rivers. Panchalas were the closest among all the allies of the

The foremost ally of the



Pandavas in the Kurukshetra Panchala prince Dhrishtadyumna was the commander-in-chief for the whole of the Pandava army. Srinjayas and Somakas were tribes allied to the Panchalas by kinship, and connected to the various branches of the same royal lineage. They lived in the various provinces of the Panchala kingdom. Moreover, the Somaka prince Sutasoma was the son of Bhima, the second Pandava. The Prabhadraka tribe were also an extended arm of the Panchalas – they were a guerrilla force - an elite group employed in the Kurukshetra War and made excellent bodyguards to the army commanders.

The Matsya kingdoms of Virat and his relatives – corresponding to the presentday Rajasthan with parts of Madhya Pradesh were also fighting on the side of the Pandavas. The fact that his daughter Uttara was married to Abhimanyu made them a

The Kekaya territory corresponds to Dera Ghazi Khan, the Punjab frontier of Pakistan Likewise, Vrihanta, the king of their northern neighbors Ulluka – although a part of the Bahalika federation next to river Ravi (then called Iravati) chose to side with the Pandavas. The Kamboja tribe also aligned themselves with the Pandavas and sent six thousand of their ace solrukshetra.

During the devastating second COVID-19 wave earlier this year, the country saw children getting affected, of which a few were severely affected. Pediatric departments of hospitals also reported post-COVID symptoms in children, especially MISC (Multisystem inflammatory syndrome in children), for

New Delhi: Health Ministry on Wednesday informed that 39,59,21,220 COVID vaccine doses have been provided to States and Union Territories so far. Of this, the total consumption including wastages is 38.07.68.770 doses as per data. Till date, 38,76,97,935 vaccine doses have been administered so far.

USELESS STATEMENTS BEING MADE TO CREATE PANIC: HEALTH MINISTER

New Delhi: Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya on Wednesday denied the claims of vaccine shortage & said that for July, the availability of doses has been increased to 13.50 crore. ability of vaccines, I have come to know from the statements of various state governments and leaders. This situation can be better understood by an actual analysis of the fact," he said.

New Delhi: A little over a week after the Supreme Court had termed the continued use of Section 66A of the Information Technology Act, 2000 as "a shocking state of affairs", the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) on Wednesday asked states and Union Territories to direct all police stations under their jurisdiction not to register cases under the repealed section of the IT Act.

immediately withdrawn. Last week, the apex court had termed the continued use of Section 66A by law enforcement agencies of various states despite the provision being struck down by the court in 2015 — as "a shocking state of affairs" and sought a response from the Centre. Section 66A empowered police to make arrests over what police-

men, in terms of their subjective discretion, could construe as "offensive" or "menacing" or for the purposes of causing annoyance, inconvenience, etc. It prescribed the punishment for sending messages through computer or any other communication device like a mobile phone, tablet, & a conviction could fetch a maximum of 3 years in jail.


The latest two deaths were reported from Sultanpur and Meerut, a government health bulletin said on Wednesday.





HIBISCUS

The use of hibiscus in culinary in the southern part of India is very prominent. Lentil curries containing hibiscus are along with its extract, is cy squash for pricy saldelicacies. It is also used to prepare relishes, jams, jellies, and tea, and can be eaten raw in salads as well! It has a hint of bitterness to it with a unique citric flavour. 
